

Speaking To The Board



Regular meetings of the School Board shall be conducted in public and the public has the right to attend those meetings. Public expression at board meetings is encouraged and a specific portion of the agenda is provided for this purpose. Written and/or oral requests by the public to be placed on the agenda must be received in the Superintendent's Office by the Wednesday prior to the board meeting. An opportunity shall also be provided during that specific portion of the agenda for persons who wish to address the board who have not made advance arrangements.

The following criteria govern the specific portion of the agenda set aside for public expression:

1. A maximum of thirty (30) minutes shall be allocated for this agenda item. The time limit for any given situation may be extended by a majority vote of the School Board.
2. Speakers shall have a maximum of five (5) minutes each or a proportionate share of the time allotted in the event more than six (6) persons wish to address the board.
3. Members of the board will listen to the remarks of the speakers; however, the policy of the board will be to take no action until the superintendent has had an opportunity to inform the board of any issue raised by the speaker.
4. Speakers must first be recognized by the president and then identify themselves by stating their name and address. Speakers are to address the board from their seat or an area designated for such purpose.
5. Some topics are not permitted to be discussed in the public forum; for example, any topic related to an employee or that can be implied to be related to an employee; special education placements and individual student situations. If the topic is inappropriate for the public forum, the president will instruct you not to speak, but rather, present your concerns in writing for the board's discussion in executive session.

6. All materials to be distributed to the board are to be given to the district clerk.
7. Speakers whose names appear on the agenda will be given an opportunity to speak first. Speakers who have not asked in advance to be on the agenda must complete the form provided by the board.

If You Have A Question

School Board meetings generally begin at 6:30 p.m., at which time the board may move into executive (non-public) session, as allowed by the Open Meetings Law of New York State. The board would then return to regular session upon conclusion of the executive session.
