IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Registration and payment with the Continuing Education Office are required BEFORE you will be permitted in class. Instructors will not accept course payment or registrations. They will accept lab fees ONLY, where noted. Please adhere to registration deadlines.
- Students of Continuing Education <u>must be at least 21</u> <u>years old.</u>
- Registration is required for all classses, even those that are free.
- You will be notified if a course is cancelled. In these instances, you will receive a refund (less the processing fee, if you registered online).
- We accept payment by check or cash for mail-in or in-person registration. A credit card can be used with online registration ONLY. No phone registrations will be accepted.
- If you are 60 years of age or older, you are entitled to a senior discount, where noted.
- Classes will not run if Hamburg Central School District's day or evening activities are cancelled due to inclement weather. In the event of such closing, you should attend the next scheduled class. In the case of single classes, you will be notified of a rescheduled date.
- Once class begins, there are no refunds except for verified medical conditions.

ENTERING OUR SCHOOLS

As part of the district's ongoing security enhancements, only certain exterior school doors will be unlocked for Continuing Ed. participants to gain entry to evening/weekend classes. At the four elementary schools, entry is through the main doors. At the Middle School, entry is on the parking lot side of the building, through door #14 near the cafeteria. At the High School, entry is through door #30 (gym door) off the Legion Drive parking lot. Thank you for your cooperation.
